Ambition should be made of sterner stuff

CEO killed in corporate mutiny

Rome, March 15: The floor of the board room was today covered in the blood of a fallen leader. Julius Caesar, CEO of a major multinational corporation was fallen today by his own board of directors after allegations of tyranny following his rise in public opinion and the recent financial success of the company.

The conspirators, lead by Cassius, a senior member of the board met with Caesar on the morning of the Ides of March at the capitol, and subsequently stabbed him 33 times. Marcus Brutus, another member of the board and trusted friend to Caesar prior to the incident, issued a public statement calling for the public's support in the takeover, saying, "People and senators, be not affrighted; Fly not; stand stiff: ambition's debt is paid."

Marc Antony, a confidante to Caesar, and his protégé, expressed his sorrow at the loss of a mentor, and a great friend.

"[Caesar is] . . . the ruins of the noblest man that ever lived in the tide of times," said Antony, shortly after the discovery of Caesar's body.

Both Marcus Brutus and Marc Antony will speak at a public press conference at the common pulpit later today, where they are expected to lay to rest any misgivings about the untimely death of Mighty Caesar.

Julius Caesar is survived by his wife, Calpurnia. They had no children. A new CEO is expected to be announced next week.
